Shed at the Orchard

MAA is proud to announce a new shed which has been constructed with modest financial outlay at the Orchard by John Holland, from a mix of: purchased & donated re-claimed wood, shed stain & screws, tenants donations, include: 4x windows & frames, 2 pairs of French doors, two rolls of roofing felt and other materials e.g.: canopy, fixing screws/bolts with grateful thanks from MAA.

This has ample size to seat approx. 10 persons, and proved so at the last Committee meeting which was held there in May.



The collection of surplus tools & equipment will be stored there, which can now be catalogued & the details made available for Members. There are also plans to organise a 'Seed Swap' in the Spring. The challenge has been in finding a name for such an awesome construction!!

Some suggestions are: Hangman's Gibbet, MAA Clubhouse, The Shed, MAA Orchard Hangout, The Hermitage, and so on......

Please would Members let us have other possible suggestions, by 20th July either via Facebook, email, in person or via phone/text to a Committee Member, once these are collated a list of suggested names will be circulated to enable Members to vote on the favourite.

Bonfires

The Committee will be attending a meeting with MTC to discuss various matters concerning both sites, most importantly the issue of bonfires. Emphasising on the point that it is part of the natural process of burning dried branches etc to create ash, which can then be added to the soil and continues the natural cycle.

Review of Trees & large shrubs

The trees and large shrubs on both sites will be reviewed on a regular basis by MTC with Denise Bagge (Committee Member) to ensure that dangerous or overhanging areas are dealt with. In May 2022 a further round of work was identified and will take place in the coming months. If any member has concerns regarding trees or bushes near their plot for consideration in the Autumn review, please contact Denise Bagge.

Allotment Pollinators

The Council's latest Allotment Regulations clearly state that the **keeping of bees is not allowed**. This refers to honey bees that are kept in hives and can have a nasty sting for those that may go too close. However, there are lots of other bees that do not sting and do an excellent job of pollinating our vegetables, fruit bushes and trees. These are wild bumble bees & solitary bees, including the Red Mason Bee, and do not require hives. Tenants can leave surplus seedlings and crop to share with others, there are also Pots Swap areas on both sites to enable tenants to help themselves, and leave any unwanted pots that others can benefit from.
