Wildlife Habitats

At the Foxes Piece Allotments Site MAA have organised small areas which are dedicated to attract wildlife to the site. We have also arranged for nesting boxes to be installed in various locations to accommodate birds, hedgehogs & bats, and plan to accommodate additional slow worms on the site to add to the present slow worm population, increasing the benefit that they can bring to the site.

We also plan to plant various flowers and herbs which will attract bees, butterflies and other beneficial insects. This has been made possible with thanks to the volunteers who have worked hard preparing this.

Competition

There will be another Allotment Competition organised by MAA and supported by MTC who generously fund this. The Judges will visit the site in June and again in August/September depending on weather conditions. There will be an award on each site for Best Beginner plus First, Second and Third places. At present there has been minimal interest for a youth/child award, if anyone would like to discuss this further, please contact Sylvania. The prizes will be awarded at the AGM again.

Fires on Site

At the specific request from MAA, the Council have agreed that fires will be allowed, but in incinerators only, from 1st November to 15th December 2024. Please ensure only dry wood & plant matter is burnt and there is no excessive smoke.

Donated Tools

Incinerators

Last year we held this event stand which was a huge success, members from both sites attended, the small plants & seedlings that were donated by other tenants were made available to others for a small donation to the Association.

Garden Companions

Most herb plants tend to flower several times each year, this will drive all the bees and insects wild with excitement from the strong fragrances.

Then we have the English Marigold and Nasturtium, the perfect companions for the allotment and each year will pop up all over the garden with bursts of fabulous colour, as well as attracting beneficial insects.

Woodchips

There plans are imminent for the installation of the second Woodchip Bay in the Foxes Piece Site, at the entrance by the flats. Thank you to the volunteers who are organising and constructing this.

The woodchips, delivered to bays on both sites, are available for all tenants to use on their allotment plot. Please note that only one local tree surgeon is authorised to access the sites to deliver these.

Attract Wildlife to Your Plot

We are currently preparing some information to assist tenants with various ways to attract beneficial insects and small animals to their plot, including solitary and bumble bees. As advised by Wild Marlow and other organisations. Which will soon be available on our website.

As good start is having a small pond attracting bees, birds, hedgehogs and of course frogs, try to ensure there are some large rocks or logs so that they can crawl out of the water.

Stay Safe on the Allotment!!

Tenants should check with their Doctor regarding a booster Tetanus Inoculation, if required this should be arranged as soon as possible.

Communal Tables

There are Communal Tables in Hanging Hill at the entrance in Prospect Road & in Foxes Piece at the entrance by the flats. Tenants can leave surplus seedlings & crop to share with others, there are tenants to help themselves, and leave any unwanted pots & trays that others can benefit from
