Plant Stand will now be 7th June 2025

Protecting Your Allotment Plot

It has been over 40 years since MAA was originally formed, with the primary aim was to protect both of the Allotment Sites, at the time we successfully prevented a very serious threat from local Property Developers, and again about 10 years later.

The Committee remain vigilant and continue to be prepared to take any steps necessary to defend the sites from any further threats.

Therefore, it is VITAL that we are supported by the majority of tenants from both sites, otherwise MAA does not have a sufficient voice to represent the Allotments Sites, should another threat arise.

Get Planting!!

By now plots should be ready for sowing & planting those delicate seedlings and plants. Some crop should already be under way such as Brassica (cabbage, broccoli, sprouts, etc), Alliums (onions, garlic & shallots) & potatoes. It is not too late to get these in over the coming month or two.

Garden Companions

There are many plants & flowers that attract beneficial insects – herbs will tick both of those boxes!!

Most herb plants tend to flower several times each year and there is a huge variety, which create a harlequin of flowers and aromas on the plot, plus many busy bees!!

The English Marigold, Wild Poppy & Nasturtium are not classed as herbs, but are excellent Garden Companions attracting those pollenating and beneficial insects, some of their flowers can also be used in the kitchen – as demonstrated by many Celebrity Chefs!!

These flowers & herbs also have health benefits and are used in many ways to ease or eradicate ailments in natural remedies.

Most can be grown from seed or buy as seedlings, there is a lot of information in books & on the internet covering this amazing subject. So, why not check it out?

Manure Deliveries

There is manure delivered to hanging Hill and is stored in a bay at the top of the hill, by the Walnut Tree. This is available for all tenants to use on their allotment plots and compost bins. Unfortunately, manure deliveries have ceased at Foxes Piece due to complaints. MAA plans to request at the next AWP meeting with the council that these are resumed for a period during the winter months.

Review of trees & large shrubs

The trees and large shrubs on both sites are reviewed on a regular basis, Denise Bagge, who has been a Committee Member for many years, is overseeing this & liaising with MTC. Priority will be given to any trees or large shrubs considered to be dangerous. Please note MAA receives an annual payment for Commission from Kings, in respect of every order submitted. This is a valuable addition to our Fighting Fund, ensuring that we are prepared, should we need this again.

Woodchips

There are two woodchip bays at Foxes Piece and four at Hanging Hill, thanks to the volunteers who are organised and constructed of these.

The woodchips delivered to these bays are for all tenants to use on their allotment plot, if they wish. When collecting the woodchips, please ensure the areas are left as tidy & as clear as possible to enable others access to the pathways.

Please note that only Newleaf Tree Surgeons are authorised to access both sites to deliver these. No other tradesmen are allowed access to either site unless with specific authority from the Council.
